Dear Parents/Carers and Children,

Welcome to the March edition of the Cage Green Newsletter.



We are now into our second week of Term 4 and the children have returned with renewed vigour. On 5 March 2015, Cage Green Primary School and the Phoenix Centre for Autism welcomed Adrian Townsend, author of "Gran's Gang" to talk to the children about his career and how to succeed as a writer as part of World Book Day. Adrian worked for 24 years as a primary Headteacher in Oxford before having a career change to become an author and playwright. After describing the tools of his trade: his garden shed, a "comfortable" pen and a lined notebook, Adrian told his audience that his story usually begins with him asking "What if ...?" He retold a chapter from "Gran's Gang" which was followed by a Question and Answer session. Mr Townsend stressed that every day should be a "Book Day" encouraging children to read and write every day. The amount of parents/carers that queued to purchase one of his books was staggering which I believe shows the commitment and importance we all place on reading. This was also evident in the amount of reading comments in the Reading Record Books.

As we all know Red Nose Day is on Friday and to support the event the school is adopting the catchphrase 'Wear Something Funny for Money'. Therefore the children will have the choice to come into school with maybe an amusing hat or a funny pair of socks or something red. **All items are to be worn along with their full school uniform**. For taking part in this we are suggesting a donation of £1. A selection of children have organised various events throughout the week including a biscuit sale on Wednesday 11 March. These will be sold to the children for 50p so if you would like your child to take part please provide them with a small amount of money. Also since the official theme this year is 'Make Your Face Funny for Money' any photographs of the children taking part in this outside of school (Boys Brigade or Brownies for example) would be greatly appreciated - I hope to create a display similar to the Extreme Reading Challenge. During the week commencing 16 March the school will again be taking part in the 'Science and Engineering Week'. The week will be a mixture of class based activities as well as workshops and theatre productions in the hall. Due to the positive reaction from the children of last year's activities, we have many of them returning. Quantum Theatre will be performing 'The Starry Messenger' and Dr Gareth Francis will be hosting many workshops. This year we have ZooLab who will be working with Key Stage 1 looking at habitats and life cycles. All these activities are kindly being funded by the P.T.A. A reminder that Parent Consultation Evenings will be held on the 29 and 30 April where you will be given the opportunity to discuss your child's progress as well as the next steps in his/her learning. 


Rag Bags

The school is taking part in a scheme called 'Rag Bags'. The 'Rag Bag' recycling scheme has been developed to provide regular fundraising for schools, clubs, nurseries and various organisations UK Wide.
