# How to be a prize-winning carnival float

So, what does it take to win first prize at Tonbridge Carnival? It might only take us 20 minutes to parade up the High Street in all our amazing costumes on a blazing hot Sunday afternoon in June but it all starts a long time before that, when the nights are cold and dark.

We found out about the carnival theme, 'Famous Families' in February. So, thinking caps on. We have lots of children taking part but not many families are that big and we need to have something that will look good, doesn't cost too much and that can be made by hand. The Peter Pan story seemed to offer us what we needed – with the Darling family and some other groups who we could think of as being families.

Recruitment started in March – we needed to know how many people we had. We used the enthusiasm of our Year 5 recruiters - Mia, Jack, and Archie from 5CH - to stand in the playground and get pupils to sign up.

We then identified the different groups and characters and started to think about how we could put their costumes together. There then followed **LOTS** of experimenting – including different sized cardboard boxes for ships, different tops and trimmings for Indians, prototype skirts for mermaids and weapons for pirates.

Mrs Armstrong also asked Steve Fitzpayne (Rhys's dad from 6E) if he'd mind building us a boat to act as a centrepiece. He said he would and we left him to it!

As the weeks ticked by, numbers had to be finalised, so letters got sent after Easter to say what characters people would be. We ended up with about 80 children – our biggest entry ever - and then set to work with getting all the materials together and then asking various people to do the making.

And while you were on your Easter and May half term holidays, staff and other helpers were up at the school painting wooden boxes to be pirate ships. And Miss Csilla and her daughter hand-painted the beautiful title banner to lead off the procession. Meanwhile, rumours started to circulate that our pirate galleon would be coming by trailer!





With June arriving, it was time to pull everything together - out with the staples, glue guns and many trips to the shops to get last minute supplies. Plus the final lists for Carnival Club – three after school sessions where the children piled into the Phoenix Centre to make, paint and stick, producing hats, flags, swords and all sorts.

With the big day in sight, a band of school staff stayed late on Friday afternoon/evening setting up the hall, so everything could be ready for 9 o'clock Sunday morning, when all the children would be collecting their costumes and props. And that needs a small army of parent helpers and staff – including mermaid hairstylists, face-painters and pirate boat fitters.

Two hours later a stream of characters were heading down to Tonbridge to form up in 30 degree temperatures. But everyone was in good spirits, especially when Mrs Dalal (Hirva, 5C/H, and Pratham's, 2A, mum) arrived with boxes of ice lollies! Our jaws all dropped when we saw the amazing pirate galleon (thank you so much Mr Fitzpayne). A few last minute adjustments (a broken pirate buckle here, a slipped boat strap there) and we were off! 75 children plus many parents and carers doing Cage Green proud as we made our way up the High Street chanting, singing and waving.









After all that, what a relief to relax in the sunshine and bask in <u>ANOTHER</u> first prize for Cage Green! Well done to Mrs Armstrong and her team who brought it all together and to the many staff, parents and children who supported and participated in this wonderful event!
